- To improve the academic performance of the institution the IQAC proposes to appoint Guest teachers in the vacant posts of various subjects.
- After surveying the local need IQAC proposed to introduce Honours courses in various subjects like Geography, Zoology, Botany, Anthropology, Music, Journalism and Mass Communication. Physical Education has been introduced as General Course.
- IQAC reminds to prepare departmental academic calendar at the beginning of the session and to assign syllabus to the departmental teachers. It suggests the departments to analyse marks of University examination and performance in internal assessment. It also recommends starting students' feedback report to sort out the drawbacks and problems and to take the necessary measures accordingly.
- IQAC advices to the faculty members to carry on the Tutorial classes as per students need.
- To make learning more students-centric and independent, the IQAC proposes to start a new internet cafe for the students. The college is trying to arrange sufficient computers

with internet connection so that the students and teachers can avail themselves of this free service.

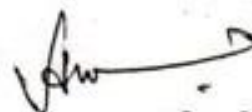
