6.3.1 Curriculum Development

As the College follows the Syllabus of West Bengal State University there is little scope of internal curricular designing, though the teachers actively participated in the Syllabus revision programme. However every department has its own academic calendar/module to run and complete the syllabus.

Bengali PG department have planed their own Syllabus.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- The basic hinterland of this College is mainly consisted with “First-Learner Group” families. The teachers employ interactive and participatory approach creating a feeling of responsibility in learning and makes learning a process of construction of knowledge.
- Student centric teaching-learning process is adopted.
- ICT enabled teaching-learning process is started in science departments.
- Map-show, Model-show, Film-show etc. related to curricula are organised by the departments.
- Class tests are regularly taken by the departments for evaluation.
- Educational excursions are conducted by some departments
