6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

As the College follows the Syllabus of West Bengal State University there is little scope of internal curricular designing, though the teachers actively participated in the Syllabus revision programme. However every department has its own academic calendar/module to run and complete the syllabus.

Bengali PG department have planed their own Syllabus.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- The basic hinterland of this College is mainly consisted with “First-Learner Group” families. The teachers employ interactive and participatory approach creating a feeling of responsibility in learning and makes learning a process of construction of knowledge.
- Student centric teaching-learning process is adopted.
- ICT enabled teaching-learning process is started in science departments.
- Map-show, Model-show, Film-show etc. related to curricula are organised by the departments.
- Class tests are regularly taken by the departments for evaluation.
- Educational excursions are conducted by some departments

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- Regular class tests are taken by for some departments.
- Students need to qualify the Test examination to appear in University Exams.
- The answer scripts of such tests are shown to the students to identify their shortfalls.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- Faculties have undertaken proposals for Major/Minor Research Projects from the D.S.T./U.G.C. respectively.
- Full autonomy is given to the Principal investigators for smooth conduct of the research project.
- Funds sanctioned by the different agencies are released without delay as and when required by the researcher.
- Space and necessary infrastructural support are provided for research work.
- IQAC has suggested to the Principal that seed money may be provided from college fund for Research projects of teachers.

➤ **Challenges:**

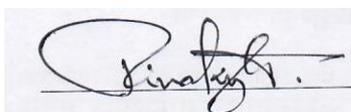

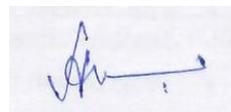
